We are honored to be promoters and witnesses of a new generation of scientists who are communicating their science through the medium of film. Since 2014, filmmaking has been part of the academic preparation of PhD students at the University of Zurich and ETH Zurich. Filmmaking has been rapidly spreading throughout academies and research centers in Switzerland, branching into different topic areas, such as "Filmmaking for Scientists", "Storytelling & Storyboarding Science", "Storyboarding Science" and "Filmmaking Marathon for Scientists and Filmmakers".

The need for a platform for scientists and filmmakers where they can meet and share their findings and experiences, motivated us to establish the Global Eco Film Festival (GEFF). The 254 films submitted from all over the world are a testimony of the high demand for the Global Eco Film Festival. This made the review process highly competitive and challenging, ultimately resulting in 7 full-length (3 of them premiere in Switzerland) and 6 short films.

We could not be where we are now without the support of numerous organizations that include the Swiss Academy of Sciences, WSL, Greenpeace Switzerland, Filmpodium Cinema, Environmental Humanities CH, LSZ Graduate School (University and ETH Zurich), EAWAG, Netzwek Cinema, Zoo Zurich, Zurich University of the Arts, CUSO (Universities of Geneva, Lausanne, Neuchatel and Fribourg), amongst others. The GEFF aims to be the Swiss international showcase of films focusing on Science, Environment and Nature.

SYNOPSIS In this tense and immersive tour de force, audiences are taken directly into the line of fire between powerful, opposing Peruvian leaders who will stop at nothing to keep their respective goals intact. On the one side is President Alan Garcia, who, eager to enter the world stage, begins aggressively extracting oil, minerals, and gas from untouched indigenous Amazonian land. He is quickly met with fierce opposition from the indigenous leader Alberto Pizango, whose impassioned speeches against Garcia's destructive actions prove a powerful rallying cry to throngs of his supporters. When Garcia continues to ignore their pleas, a tense war of words erupts into deadly violence.

Mathew Orzel is an awardwinning filmmaker whose work focuses on the complexities of human relations. Orzel graduated with honors in visual communication from the University of Wales. He worked as a sound designer, editor and director in short films before co-founding Yachaywasi.


