

Objectives

After the end of the main national environmental research programs (SPP Environment, NRP 31) there is a lack of events where the Swiss global change community can meet as a whole and discuss ongoing problems in a transdisciplinary manner. The aim of the Swiss Global Change Day is to present recent research highlights in global environmental change research as well as to point out future challenges in these research areas. Besides there is the opportunity for people from governmental institutions, economy and politics to ask questions and explain their needs and views on the presented topics. Panel discussions and a round table discussion will provide the corresponding frame.

Poster Session and Travel award

The event is also an opportunity to "recycle" posters that have been shown at international meetings during the last year and to present them to the Swiss research community.

The best two posters in each of the three fields of WCRP, IGBP and IHDP* respectively will be selected by a jury. The authors (*students or post-docs*) of these posters will receive a travel award of 1000.- each, which will allow them to attend an international conference in the current year.
