1) 2015 ScNat bicentenary – Species 200

The list of <u>200 species</u> is now complete! Many thanks to all the researchers who have contributed. We are starting to work on the poster, which should be available in June for the <u>ScNat anniversary</u> party in Bern, along with a statement on the importance of the ScNat (past) support for the study of biodiversity. 2) Biology15

The Swiss conference on organismic biology took place at <u>Eawag</u>, the Swiss Federal Institute of Aquatic Science and Technology, at the Dübendorf Campus close to Zürich, on 12 and 13 February 2015.



Roughly 200 participants from all over the country found their way to Dübendorf and discussed the most interesting findings in Swiss organismic biology, ranging from plant-pollinator coevolution to climate change modelling, and human evolution to behavioural ecology. *Biology15* featured 20 gender balanced student talks, four keynote lectures and the Darwin Dinner Lecture (more info: http://www.biology15.eawag.ch).

The next meeting, Biology16, will take place in Lausanne.

4) New ScNat website, SSS, and Systematics pages


