



1) 7th SSS-Day in Geneva, 13-14th November 2014

This two days meeting will include, on the first day, a workshop on the use of R in phylogenetics: the instructor will be Klaus Schliep (<http://darwin.uvigo.es/kschliep/>). Dr Schliep is a specialist of phylogenetic analyses in R and the developer of the package phangorn (<http://cran.r-project.org/web/packages/phangorn/index.html>).



Our invited speaker for the second day of the meeting will be Ben Warren (<https://sites.google.com/site/bwarrenresearch/home>). Dr Warren is a specialist of insular communities and works on the biogeography of birds and plants in several island systems.

During this second day, we'll also have time for regular talks and the SSS general assembly.
