### The Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services (IPBES)

IPBES's mission:

To strengthen knowledge foundations for better policy through science, for the conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity, long-term human well-being and sustainable development.

- An independent intergovernmental body, established in 2012 by Governments, with currently 130 Members
- IPBES is currently implementing its first work programme (2014-2018)
- Collaborative partnership arrangement with UNEP, UNESCO, FAO and UNDP
- Secretariat hosted by Germany, in Bonn










IPBES assessment of scenarios and models of biodiversity and ecosystem services (focused on methods)

- Released in 2016
- Uptake:
  - BiodivERsA/Belmont Forum joint research call for proposals on scenarios and models of biodiversity and ecosystem services: 25 million Euros
  - Decision of the Convention on Biological Diversity (Global Biodiversity Outlook 5)
- Phase 2 of scenario work
