

# 24th Swiss Global Change Day: Terms and Conditions for participation and Criteria for the poster evaluation

## Background

The Swiss Global Change Day is the annual event organised by ProClim where well-known experts present challenges and highlights of climate and global change research covering a broad range of topics.

This event is also an opportunity for students and post-docs to show research results by posters and to discuss them with colleagues. The most attractive and comprehensive posters will be honoured with a travel award of 1000 francs which allows the winners to attend an international conference in the current year.

## Posters can be submitted in the following categories

### – Geosphere · Biosphere

How the biological, chemical and physical processes interact and respond to climate change with topics including carbon cycle, land use and cover changes, biodiversity, past climate changes and others.

### – Atmosphere · Hydrosphere

Understanding of the physical climate system and hydrological processes, with topics including predictability of climate, stratosphere-troposphere, water cycle, radiation and energy transmission, cryosphere and others.

### – Human Dimensions · Sustainability

How humans affect and are affected by climate and global change, with specific topics including environmental consciousness, communication, values, behaviour, transformation, 'turning knowledge into action'.

The poster should be self-explanatory, it is not intended to provide explanations on site. The award winners will be called on stage at the award ceremony and will be asked to briefly present the poster on stage.

## Terms and conditions

- If you would like to enter the poster contest, please register for the event first and in good time. As soon as you have registered, you will receive a separate e-mail with further instructions on how to submit your poster.
- Deadline for submitting your poster is **2 April 2024, 12:30 noon**.  
No timely submission, no contest. The submitted poster (pdf file, max. 10 MB) will be used by the jury to evaluate it in advance and to determine the winner of the poster award. The timely and correct submission is the sole responsibility of the poster contest participants.
- You have the possibility to present your poster without entering the contest - no pdf submission required then.
- Bring your printed poster with you, we recommend a DIN A0 size.
- Former winners may not enter the contest.
- Make sure you have registered your poster in the appropriate category. With your event registration your poster will be assigned provisionally. We reserve the right to reassign your poster to the appropriate category.
- The award is intended to be redeemed for attending a conference in the current year (2024). With a well-founded and approved request, the award can also be redeemed in the following year (2025). After that, the award will expire.
- The jury's decision is final and no correspondence about the contest will be entered into.

## Criteria for the poster evaluation

### Design · Concept

- Is the poster eye-catching?
- Are the structures and optical elements helpful in guiding you through the poster?
- Is there an overriding logical concept underpinning the structure of the poster?

### Content · Elements

- Is the content of the poster relevant? (novelty, originality)
- Are the following elements immediately visible?
  - Research questions / hypothesis
  - Research methods
  - State of research
  - Results (preliminary) / conclusions

### Text

- Is the text on the poster inviting to read and easily readable?
- Is the text well compressed to the essential?
- Is the language simple and clear?

### Figures · Graphs

- Are the figures and graphs on the poster attractive and easy to understand?
- Are the legends clear and helpful?
