Why publish in MetZet?

Preserving scientific journals that have often been published for more than a hundred years, and whose editorship is in the hands of scientific associations such as DMG, EGU, AGU, etc., continues to provide an important alternative and counterpoint to purely commercially oriented publishers such as Frontiers (Springer Nature), MDPI or Elsevier. However, community-based journals are only viable if the scientific community also publishes relevant articles in them. One of these journals is the *Meteorologische Zeitschrift – Contributions to Atmospheric Sciences* (**MetZet**), which is published by the meteorological societies from Germany (DMG), Austria (ÖGM) and Switzerland (SGM).

MetZet is published by three scientific societies that do not pursue any commercial interests. The fees charged are used exclusively for the journal's technical and editorial realisation in cooperation with a publisher (Borntraeger Science Publishers).

MetZet is a fully Open Access journal. All papers published since 2014 can be accessed by scientists and academics free of charge via the internet (www.metzet.de). **MetZet** therefore meets a requirement made by most scientific and academic funding organisations.

MetZet is published in English. This means that its contents can be communicated worldwide.

MetZet reports on current developments in meteorology, atmospheric physics and climate research. This is ensured by appointing scientists and academics with appropriate expertise to the Editorial Board.

MetZet is internationally oriented, but also provides a particularly suitable platform for publishing regional studies conducted in the D-A-CH area (Germany, Austria, Switzerland) through its supporting societies.

MetZet relies entirely on the scientific expertise of its honorary editors and the reviewers appointed by them for peer reviewing each submitted manuscript.

MetZet is listed in all important citation databases and indices (e.g. Clarivate/ISI, Scopus, ...). The number of citations referencing papers in MetZet has continued to increase significantly from year to year.

MetZet usually publishes an accepted manuscript online about 3 to 5 months following its submission. This length of time is required for a scientifically sound, competent and transparent peer review process.

MetZet has more than 150 years of experience in publishing important research papers in meteorology and climatology. Several thousand scientific papers have been published since its foundation in 1866. The most cited papers are listed at <https://www.schweizerbart.de/journals/metz/topcitedpapers>. MetZet's current format was created following the political upheavals in 1990 by merging the Meteorologische Rundschau (FRG), Zeitschrift für Meteorologie (GDR) and Wetter und Leben (A). For more than 30 years now, the Meteorologische Zeitschrift has existed as a new series under the name it was first given in 1886.
