

• Employment contract and appointment of Dr Frédérick Bordry (FR) as Director for Accelerators and Technology extended from Jul 18, 2019 to Dec 31, 2020

— Council:

- Prof. Sijbrand de Jong (NL) re-elected as president for a 3rd one-year term starting in Jan 2018
- Prof. Eliezer Rabinovici (IL) and Prof. Jens Gaardhøje (DK) re-elected as vice-presidents for a 3rd one-year term starting in Jan 2018 and Jul 2018, respectively

— Scientific policy committee:

- Prof. Keith Ellis (UK) re-appointed as chair for a 2nd one-year mandate starting on Jan 2018
- 2+2 other SPC members, R. Cousins (USA) and M.-H. Schune (FR), G. Martinelli (IT) and H. Schellman (USA), appointed or reappointed for a three-year period starting on Jan 2018
 - NB: currently one SPC member, Prof. Laura Baudi (2016-2018), is also a CHIPP member

CERN enlargement process



- ☐ Associate Member State progessing towards Membership:
 - Serbia (associate member since 2012): task force visited country in March 2018
- ☐ States progessing towards Associate Membership:
 - Croatia: applied in May 2014, task force visited country in May 2018
 - **Brazil:** model agreement sent by CERN in 2013, no recent progress
- ☐ Recent contacts in view of possible applications:
 - Australia, Canada, Estonia, Ireland, Latvia, South Korea
- New International Cooperation Agreements (ICA):
 - Philippines, Russian Federation, Thailand
- ☐ Council decided to set up a working group to review certain aspects of the geographical enlargement policy of 2010
 - mandate includes policy, financial and procedural issues



Science Gateway



■ New CERN project/dream:

- a hub for education, training and outreach, to be built around the Globe, aiming at satisfying the > 300'000 visit requests per year
- 7000 m², incl. 1000-seat auditorium, 50–70 MCHF to be covered fully from donations
- CERN looking for sponsors, received already 10 MCHF from private foundation





LHC roadmap




2017: record lumi = 2.2×10^{34} cm⁻²s⁻¹

- 50 fb⁻¹ to ATLAS/CMS, 1.8 fb⁻¹ to LHCb

2018: last year of Run 2 data-taking

– goal: 60 fb⁻¹ in ATLAS/CMS, 2 fb⁻¹ in LHCb







☐ Luminosity goals:

 $-300 \text{ fb}^{-1} \text{ by LS3}, 3000 \text{ fb}^{-1} \text{ by } \sim 2037$




Upgrades of the LHC experiments swiss in Particle




- □ LS2 (2019–2020): ATLAS, CMS, LHCb and ALICE upgrades
 - construction in full swing (new CMS pixel detector installed since early 2017)
- □ LS3 (2024–2026): ATLAS and CMS Phase-2 upgrades
 - 10 Technical Design Reports submitted (end 2016–end 2017)
 - Review process (involving 106 reviewers) concluded in April 2018
 - Global and detailed view of required resources now available
 - total cost: ATLAS = 267 MCHF, CMS = 279 MCHF
 - Share of investment responsibilities by sub-detector system and by country (« money matrix ») will be finalized by October 2018
- ☐ LS4 (~2030): possible LHCb upgrade II
 - Expression of interest submitted (Feb 2017), physics document in prep. (2018),
 TDR (≥2020)




Cumulative Budget Deficit



Baby-MIND detector installed at J-PARC (shipped from CERN to Japan, Oct–Dec 2017)


- ☐ September 2018
