## PhD position in archaeo-anthropology

Centre for Archaeological Science (CAS), University of Wollongong, Australia



*As part of a DECRA fellowship funded by the Australian Research Council (ARC), the Centre for Archaeological Science at the University of Wollongong, is seeking to award a PhD scholarship to a high calibre candidate for a project entitled “Mortuary practices in Iron Age Siberia”, as part of an international collaboration.*

### PHD SCHOLARSHIP

#### *Project overview*

The main aim of this 3-year PhD project is to better understand the mortuary practices that took place at Tunnug 1 (Kokel culture; 2<sup>nd</sup>-4<sup>th</sup> c. CE) and, in general, during Iron Age Siberia, through the integration of archaeo-anthropology and forensic science. On the one hand, experiments will be carried out to increase our understanding of mummification practices by freezing, and the effect of freezing on macroscopic and microscopic alterations of soft tissue and bone. On the other hand, human remains from Tunnug 1 will be studied from an archaeo-anthropological point of view in order to reconstruct sequential mortuary practices.

#### *Desirable background and experience*

We are seeking an outstanding graduate with a strong academic record. Applicants should have a background in biological anthropology, bioarchaeology, forensic science or archaeological science. Skills in archaeometry, histology and virtual anthropology (3D imaging, micro-tomography) are a plus, as is experience with recently deceased human remains.

### ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA – PROFILE AND SKILLS REQUIRED

Applicants must demonstrate a capacity to carry out independent research in an international team and have adequate training and ability to pursue the proposed course of study. The PhD scholarship is for study at the University of Wollongong in Australia, for a person who has achieved Honours First Class, Masters or equivalent.

Both domestic and international prospective students are welcome to apply.
