Title: How much responsibility do researchers bear for their misconducts? Christine Clavien

Abstract: We often overestimate humans' degree of control over their choices. We also overlook how much their choices are bound to the decision framework in which they are placed. I will roughly map the factors causally involved in researchers' decisions to commit (or not) research misconducts. This analysis will shed some light on the extent to which one can hold researchers responsible for their misconducts. This will lead me to question the practical effect of ordinary teaching of research integrity (which mainly targets students' rational minds).
