

REGULATIONS OF THE FUND FOR THE PROMOTION OF YOUNG SCIENTISTS

Issued by the Board of the SSHL on September 17, 2001. Regulations revised on June 16, 2023.

Article 1 Purpose

The SSHL supports students, doctoral candidates, or postdocs from hydrology and limnology in their research work with subsidiary contributions.

Article 2 Responsibilities

The Board appoints a committee to consider each application for support. This committee consists of at least two board members with expertise in the respective application's subject matter. The committee reviews and evaluates the application and determines the amount of the support contribution. In particular, consideration is given to the contribution of the applicant's institution. The contribution from the fund for young scientists can only ever be subsidiary.

Article 3 Areas of Support

The SSHL supports the following projects:

- participation in conferences, workshops, and seminars with presentation of scientific work
- publication
- guest stays at other research institutions/internships
- data collection as part of research work

Article 4 Eligibility

Young scientists who are individual members of the SSHL are eligible for support.

Article 5 Financing

An amount for projects eligible for support under these regulations is allocated annually in the budget. The general assembly determines the amount of budgetary funds when approving the budget.

Article 6 Disbursement

Fund beneficiaries provide a brief report on their funded project or activity. The disbursement of the support contribution takes place after the submission of the report.

Article 7 Final Provisions

The SSHL informs in its annual report about the young scientist promotion projects. The SSHL may publish the short reports prepared by the fund's beneficiaries.

The following subsidiary support contributions are provided:

For all applications, the SSHL covers a maximum of 50% of the total costs.
