

Experience reports of the td-net web portal for co-producing knowledge

Guiding principles for authors

In the **shared experiences section**, td researchers report about their experiences with the methods of the td-net toolbox. They illustrate in which context they applied the methods and to what extent they adopted the methods with the aim to co-produce knowledge and develop the methods further. The audience is interested to read what works, what the challenges and lessons learned are, etc.

There is not a specific template for experience reports, but we kindly ask the authors to follow some guiding principles:

- Use paragraphs to structure your text. Paragraphs should not exceed 250 words and be introduced by a title: e.g. context, project description (short!), purpose of the method applied, participants, lessons learnt, reflections/open questions, do's and don'ts, results. Titles may be formulated as questions.
- Add some pictures to illustrate your experience (including the right to publish them on our website).
- Indicate a hyperlink to further readings about the project (if online and public).
- Add your contact details.

The writing process will be supported by Sibylle Studer (project leader of the td-net toolbox (td-methods@scnat.ch)). Based on a draft version of the experience report, the authors may be invited to refine the text according to the feedback from the **editors** of the td-net toolbox.
