Posters can only be submitted after prior registration for the event. As soon as you have registered, you will receive a separate e-mail with further instructions on how to submit your poster.

#### Geosphere • Biosphere

How the biological, chemical and physical processes interact and respond to climate change with topics including carbon cycle, land use and cover changes, biodiversity, past climate changes and others.

#### Atmosphere · Hydrosphere

Understanding of the physical climate system and hydrological processes, with topics including predictability of climate, strato-sphere-troposphere, water cycle, radiation and energy transmission, cryosphere and others.

#### Human Dimensions • Sustainability

How humans affect and are affected by climate and global change, with specific topics including environmental consciousness, communication, values, behaviour, transformation, 'turning knowledge into action'.


