- Between conflict and cooperation -

Against each other and together represent opposing ends of a very broad and variable spectrum of behavior. These two strategies are deeply rooted in the evolutionary history of human adaptation, both biologically and culturally speaking.

With its comparative look at humans through time and space, the science of anthropology can contribute significantly to our understanding of the behaviors conflict and cooperation.

The investigation is not simply focused on the reasons for conflict within a group, between the sexes, or between populations or other groups, rather, it sheds light on how we as humans treat one another during confrontations and also the various solutions to a conflict situation that are sought in order to reach a collective, higher goal.

The 12th International Congress of the Society for Anthropology will focus on this socially and politically important theme. Examples taken from archaeological, historical and forensic contexts will receive equal consideration with those instances originating from biological, paleoanthropological, and human ethnological backgrounds.

Some of the invited speakers hail from scientific fields unrelated to anthropology and were specifically chosen for this reason so that this topic could be elucidated from different viewpoints.

Meeting presentations:

Participants are asked to submit abstracts for presentations or posters by **June 1st, 2017**. These will be reviewed and evaluated for acceptance by the scientific committee (GfA executive committee). The scientific program will be organized based upon those presentations and posters accepted.

All accepted abstracts will be published in the congress booklet. Abstracts and posters are to be submitted in English.

The scientific committee will:

- Provide confirmation of abstract submittal to the corresponding author.
- Review all abstracts to decide over acceptance or rejection for the scientific program.
- -Inform the corresponding author of an acceptance or rejection, the latter with an explanation.

The committee may suggest a change from a presentation to a poster or vice versa.

Young scientist prize:

The best presentation and best poster given by a young scientist, including PhD candidates, will be awarded 150 Euros by the GfA.

Hubert-Walter-Prize:

This young scientist award is presented by the Society of Anthropology in memory of Prof. Dr. h.c. Hubert Walter. The prize is awarded every four years to a young scientist in recognition for the most outstanding dissertation in the area of anthropology. The prize money, which was originally 500 Euros, has been increased by the Hubert Walter family to 1500 Euros for the 2017 winner.
