

IPCC Climate Change 2013

The fifth IPCC assessment report continues the series of comprehensive reports regarding climate change. The IPCC reports appear periodically and describe in detail the observed and projected climate change, its causes, impacts and possible mitigation and adaptation strategies. They represent the basis for anybody dealing with climate change, be it in research, public administration, industry, the service sector, or politics. The IPCC assessment report consists of the reports of the three working groups I, II and III of the IPCC. Volume I contains the *scientific basis*, volume II describes *Impacts, Adaptation and Vulnerability* and volume III deals with the aspect of *Mitigation*.



This event offers an insight in the reports of working groups II – *Impacts, Adaption and Vulnerability* – and working group III – *Mitigation*. Swiss researchers who have been engaged in the elaboration of the IPCC report will present key messages of the *Summary for Policymakers* and of the chapters they were involved. The focus will be on topics with relevance for Switzerland. The event addresses decision makers from public administration, business and politics, as well as scientists, the media and the interested public.
